What's the Difference?

INSULT

sin

expression of impatience, contempt, bitterness, hatred, or vengeance

to get even—revenge

to belittle

Raca "You fool!"—
literally "empty-head, numbskull"
(Matt 5:22)

spoken in anger

result of anger (Matt 5:22)



discipline

expression of love

to warn, wake up,
restore to a right relationship,
bring to the place of blessing

to correct

hypocrites, dogs, swine,
blind men, blind guides,
fools, whitewashed tombs,
serpents, brood of vipers
(Matt 3:7; 23:13, 16, 17, 24, 26, 27, 33)

spoken in anger (righteous indignation)

result of wrong priorities in others
(Matt 23:17)



- insult and rebuke may be the same word (names, epithets) but the motives and goals differ (comp. Matt 5:22 with 23:17)
 - insult and rebuke are easily confused by the person addressed (Luke 11:45)
 - recipients of rebuke may wrongly judge your motives as sour grapes or sweet revenge
